City of San Antonio Updates

The San Antonio Planning Department recently held a review of the draft land use plan for the airport area. This plan is a part of the comprehensive plan being developed under the SA Tomorrow Initiative. The scope of the SA Tomorrow effort includes three parts; a Comprehensive Plan which covers land use, urban design, and municipal policy to coordinate City resources; a Sustainability Plan which covers economic, environmental, and social sustainability; and a Multimodal Transportation Plan which covers forward thinking for all modes of transportation. The SA Tomorrow plan covers the time period through 2040.

The plan will guide specific activities in areas of land use, infrastructure, and public services. Each area of the city will be included in an area or corridor plan. Churchill Estates will be included in the future plan for the Far North area.

The SA Tomorrow plan is intended to guide the city and county through the rapid growth the area is experiencing. Bexar County is expected to add up to 1.1 million new residents, with 500,000 new jobs, and 500,000 new dwelling units by 2040. If not properly prepared for this growth, the impacts could have significant consequences for overall quality of life.

BEFORE FREEZING WEATHER


- Wrap all outdoor exposed pipes or in unheated areas of the home.
- Remove garden hoses from outside faucets.
- Insulate outside faucets with Styrofoam, rags or paper.

IN SUB-FREEZING WEATHER

- Drip outside faucets 24 hours a day (5 drops per minute). This is not necessary unless temperatures are expected to be 30 degrees or below for at least 4 hours. (Be sure to turn off the faucets after the threat of freezing weather.)
- Open cabinet doors under sinks adjacent to outside walls.
- In unheated garages, shut off water to washing machines. Water softeners should be drained and protected from freezing temperatures.
- In sustained sub-freezing weather, let water drip slowly from all indoor faucets.
- Take extra care to protect pipes that have frozen in the past.
- Protect plants from freezing by covering them with commercial plant-cover fabric, towels, or a light blanket with plastic sheeting on top of it (if available).

Accomplishments in 2022 and Goals for 2023

As we get ready to welcome the new year, please consider some of the significant accomplishments for our community in 2022 as well as some goals for 2023:

- Initiated a five-year plan for maintenance and repair of the streets in our community. Phase 1 of the work, which included repairs to Snip and most of Triple Crown, is complete. Work will resume on another section of streets in 2023 and will continue each year until all of the streets are repaired and seal-coated.
- Upgraded the camera system at the Triple Crown gate and installed a new camera system at the exit gate on Snip.
- Homeowners approved the proposed amendment allowing the Board to work on behalf of the community to negotiate access agreements with fiber carriers, including Google Fiber, AT&T, and Spectrum. Ongoing discussions are now taking place with Google Fiber, which was the first carrier to approach our HOA for permission to install their fiber in our gated community.

Some of the goals planned for 2023 include:

- Continue to promote roadway safety in our community by reminding residents to comply with the posted speed limit, obey stop signs, and watch out for children, pedestrians and bicyclists on our streets. Residents can help spread this safety message by reminding guests and visitors about the need to drive slow in our community.
- Continue with phase two of the street maintenance and repair work. Residents will receive notifications before road work begins on their street.
- Explore ways to encourage homeowner involvement in our HOA. Homeowners can get involved by participating in community events, attending HOA meetings, serving on a committee, running for a position on the board. The Board of Directors welcomes any ideas from homeowners on other ways to increase participation.

Electrical Lines on the Move

CPS Energy is planning to remove the overhead electrical lines located behind some of the homes on Triple Crown and Preakness Ln and install the lines underground. The project,



which has been in the planning stage for months, also will include installation of transformers and other equipment, some of which will be installed in ground.

The project is expected to begin in December. Homeowners impacted by the project can expect to receive additional information from CPS Energy before work begins.

Texas housing market calms in third quarter of 2022

Activity in the Texas housing market slowed in the third quarter this year, according to the 2022-Q3 Texas Quarterly Housing Report released today by Texas Realtors. The 97,711 homes sold in Texas in the third quarter represents a 10% decline from the previous quarter and 15% from the third quarter of 2021. However, while the \$345,000 median sales price dipped 3.6% lower than the second quarter this year, it is still 11.3% higher than the third quarter of 2021.

"We had two years of an unprecedented housing market," said Russell Berry, chairman of Texas Realtors. "The number of homes being sold now is closer to sales numbers prior to the pandemic. While higher interest rates present a challenge for buyers, the good news is that buyers have more homes to choose from and are less likely to find themselves in a bidding war. Sellers may have to wait longer to get an offer, but home prices in many markets are still close to the all-time highs recorded earlier this year."

Months of housing inventory—a supply-and-demand statistic that measures how long it would take to sell all homes currently for sale at the current pace of sales—increased from 2.1 months in the second quarter to 2.7 months in the third quarter. The third quarter of 2021 had only 1.6 months of inventory.

Chairman Berry concluded, "While statewide trends are interesting, buyers and sellers need to know what's going on in their local area. Even different parts of the same neighborhood sometimes have varied market conditions. That's why it's critical to work with a Realtor—to have a professional by your side to guide you every step of the way."
